This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and

what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Curriculum music is taught using Kapow and the Model Music Curriculum (published March 2021) as its framework. Sing Up Music scheme is also incorporated into our music curriculum teaching.

This includes:

- Whole class music lessons are taught every term using Kapow as scheme of progression of skills.
- Snapshot Singing sessions in each year group, three times a year, to support the implementation of progress made.
- Whole class ensemble teaching in Spring term as part of the curriculum for a minimum of 6 weeks. The current offer is. Glockenspiel (Year 3 & 4), Hand chimes (Year 6)
- Concert/ performing experience as a finale to whole class instrumental learning
- Singing as part of a specialist-led assembly (Worship through song) 20 minutes per week.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- Small group and one-to-one music lessons are offered in a variety of instruments with peripatetic staff who offer a programme of lessons on a weekly basis. Currently on offer – Piano, fife, flute, guitar and drums. These lessons are taught in our school music room.
- Pupils are encouraged to join our Key Stage 2 Performance Choir which meets weekly as a free after school club throughout the year and offers the opportunity to perform at local events (such as, School Fayre, Church, services and Village lighting of the Christmas Tree).
- The school choir are also involved in collaborative concerts and performances with ARMONICO CONSORT ACADEMY. Last year, the choir performed at The Royal Albert Hall.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- All pupils have the opportunity to perform as part of our Christmas celebrations, including the traditional Nativity play in Acorns, Christmas plays and a Christmas concert in St Catherines Church with Class 5 and 6.
- Our Spring concert celebrates the return of some of our Alumni students performing to our children and their families.
- Opportunities for watching high quality live music include trips out of school such as Bournemouth Symphony orchestra at Westlands and Armónico Consort Academy orchestra at The Royal Alberts Hall.
- Westfield Academy Music Students perform for the whole school every year at the end of the summer term.
- We put on an annual summer show with our Year 6 leavers –These bespoke performance gives the pupils the chance to be part of a full musical production.
- We provide opportunities for regular showcasing musical talents, such as Praise assembly. Last year we held our first All Saints Got Talent show.

In the future
