As I'm sure you are aware, KS2 SATs are just a few weeks away now (11<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> May). The children have come back eager and ready to tackle this next challenge - thank you for the continued support.

Please find below an outline of the topics that will be covered this term:

Summer Term	
English	Narrative writing Persuasive writing SPaG Revision, Reading Strategies.
Maths	Revision of all areas, including Decimals, Percentages, Algebra, Converting units, Perimeter area and volume, Ratio, Statistics. Problem Solving.
Science	Living things and their habitats, Evolution and Inheritance, Circulatory System
Geography	Orienteering and map skills.
Art	Identity and Shadow Puppets.
DT	Textiles and independence with food.
RE	Kingdom of God – What kind of King is Jesus? Hinduism: How can Brahman be everywhere and in everything?
PSHE	Being My Best, Growing and Changing
Computing	Programing: an introduction to Python
Music	Composing - Celebrations Musical theatre – Year 6 Play
PE	Athletics, Fitness, Outdoor Adventure, Tennis

As you can see, where applicable, we have tried to link our units to the topic as much as possible, whilst ensuring we are still in full preparation for the Year 6 expectations.

### **Reading and Homework**

Reading at home continues to be one of the best contributions you can make to your child's education. The expectation for reading at All Saints is 4 times per week at home with reading records being brought each week.

Homework will continue to use the CGP books up until the SATS. Your child is welcome to choose any areas from the books that they would like to practice. After SATs, homework will focus on learning lines, songs and dances for the school performance.

## **PE**

This term Year 6 will have PE on a Tuesday and a Friday - please can we ensure that PE kits are in school throughout term time. There have been a few occasions where children have not brought in their kit.
